South Carolina This Indenture made the 21<sup>st</sup> of August 1793 in the year of our Lord one thousand  
 three hundred and ninety three between General Thomas Sumter of Lancaster county in the State of South Carolina  
 aforesaid of the one part and Gale Driggle of Lancaster county in the said State of the other part witnesseth that the said  
 Thomas Sumter for and in consideration of the sum of ten Shillings Sterling money to him in hand paid at and before the  
 sealing and delivery of these presents he receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged hath granted bargained sold alien-  
 at released and confirmed and by these presents doth grant bargain sell alien release convey and confirm unto the  
 said Gale Driggle in his actual possession and being by virtue of a bargain and sale to him hereof made from  
 whole year by chancery bearing date the day next before the day of her birth of her present and by force of the Statute for  
 transposing uses into possession and to his heirs and assigns for ever all that plantation or tract of land containing two  
 hundred acres of land lying on Driggle creek as expressed in the lease and that together with all and singular the  
 rights members and appurtenances to the said tract of land belonging or in anywise appertaining unto the Recitee  
 and diverses premises aforesaid and his heirs and assigns hereof and also all the estate right title interest  
 possession profits claim and demands whatsoever either in Law and Equity to the said Thomas Sumter of in all the said  
 tract of land so above and to all the said tract of land hereby granted and delivered or received and intent  
 ed to be hereby granted and delivered with him and every of his appurtenances unto the said Gale Driggle his  
 heirs and assigns for ever and the said Thomas Sumter for himself his heirs Executors and Administrators doth  
 hereby covenant grant and agree to and agree to and with the said Gale Driggle his heirs and assigns that he the  
 said Thomas Sumter his heirs and every of them the said tract of land with the appurtenances unto the said Gale Drig-  
 gles his heirs and assigns against him the said Thomas Sumter his heirs and every of them and all and every other per-  
 son and persons whatsoever lawfully claiming or to claim the premises or any part thereof shall and will have  
 and recover and for ever defend by these presents In Witness whereof the said Thomas Sumter hath hereunto set his  
 hand and affixed his seal the day and year first above written signed sealed and delivered in presence

This Indenture made the twenty ninth day of February anno 1794 Between Sittler  
 Rains of the State of South Carolina and Lancaster County of the one part and James Douglass of the  
 State and County aforesaid of the other part witnesseth that said Sittleron for and in consideration  
 of the sum of twelve pounds Sterling to him in hand paid the receipt whereof he doth hereby acknow-  
 ledge hath bargained and sold unto the said James Douglass and to his heirs for ever a half of one  
 certain tract of land situated lying and bounding on the creek called Run Creek and Run for hundred  
 acres beginning at a White Oak and running thence S. 5 E 54° 79 to a Stake then N. 85 E. just half the  
 line of this to a Stake then N. 5 W. 54° 79 to the first line the side of the tract lying on Harry Shavers line  
 to the said James Douglass the one half of the tract one hundred and fifty acres more or less with  
 all Woods and improvement to have and to hold the same for ever with all and every of the same and  
 diversions & improvements old and new and remains Plants and profits to have and to hold the same  
 in fee and common usage to the said James Douglass his heirs and assigns for ever, every claim or  
 demand of any person or persons for ever shall and for ever remain and be ever defunct by these  
 presents In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & Seal the day above written  
 signed sealed and delivered in presence of us

Sittleron Rains

State of South Carolina Lancaster County Personally appeared before me Joseph Lee Esq one of the Justices  
 appointed to keep the Peace in the said county Deponent & his Father who being duly sworn as the  
 said Deponent maketh oath and saith that he was personally present (as well as Harry Shaver & Francis  
 Motherhead) and saw Sittleron Rains sign seal and deliver the within Instrument of writing for his  
 purpose therein expressed that he heard Sittleron Rains declare and agree that the wagon Road lead-  
 ing the south end of it to town should be the division line between James Douglass to whom he sold the  
 aforesaid one half of the 300 acre tract and his brother Edmund Rains who was to possess the remainder of the  
 tract on the western side of the aforesaid road & that he did see Harry Shaver & Francis Motherhead sign the within  
 instrument with himself when he signed the same he likewise saw Sittleron Rains deliver unto the said James Douglass  
 as evidence with himself when he signed the same he likewise saw Sittleron Rains deliver unto the said James Douglass  
 full payment of the within premises in testimony whereof he has set his hand this 22<sup>nd</sup> day of August 1794
