Know all men by these presents that I William Harrison of the District of Lancaster in the State aforesaid for and in consideration of twenty Dollars, to me in hand paid by Benjamin Meador of the same District and State aforesaid have granted bargained sold & released unto these presents do grant and bargain sell and release unto the said Benjamin Meador all that tract or parcel of Land containing seventy five Acres, situate in the District of Lancaster on the waters of Head creek bounded West by William Kitchens line beginning corner X along the said line to George Harrison, along said line to Edward Kitchens, thence to John Right's line a back corner, thence along a line made by Eliza White & John Right, to the beginning corner by a flat line with others, together with all and singular the rights, members, hereditaments and appurtenances, to the said premises belonging, or in any wise incident or appertaining to have and to hold all and singular the premises before mentioned unto said Benjamin Meador his heirs and assigns forever against all and singular the said executors and administrators, so granted and for ever against all and singular myself and my heirs, and against every person whatsoever, lawfully claiming or to claim the same or any part thereof, witness my hand and seal this ~~20th~~^{21st} day of October in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and one, and in the twenty fifth year of the Independence of the United States of America In witness whereof I have set my hand and affixed my seal this 21st day of October A.D. 1801.
